Better Process Control School will be held in Fayetteville October 31 -November 2, 2017 at the Student Union building, Room 510-511. Registration will begin Tuesday morning at 7:30 am. Please arrive early as we will start at 8:30am exactly.

Parking will be at the Stadium Parking Garage just off Stadium Drive which is adjacent to the Student Union building. Please contact Steve Seideman by October 14 if you need parking permits. Your request must include the car owner's name, address and license tag number.

Classes will end each day at about 4-5pm. Lunch is on your own, but you are encouraged to eat in the Student Union as we will only allow 1 hour for lunch.

The cost is \$425 for acidified foods and \$550 for Low acid foods. If your product has a pH that is consistently below 4.6, it is considered an Acidified food especially if you add an acid like vinegar, lemon juice and many fruits. Low acid foods are those products with a pH over 4.6 such as beets, carrots, most vegetables.

The acidified class runs the first 1 ½ days. The low acid food class lasts all three days.
